LA is planning for hundreds of thousands of new homes...just not in singlefamily zones

Los Angeles and California have a housing crisis, a well know issue that continues to

plague our city. High rents, expensive housing costs, and evictions are common.

To address the statewide housing crisis, the state has mandated a goals of planning for 457,000 new homes by 2029. But, our city's current zoning can't provide for that number of homes. The City has stated they will increase capacity by 250,000 homes...but not in areas zoned for single family homes.

Proponents of single family neighborhoods, which predominate, are in favor of the new plans. Affordable housing developers, tenant organizations, and advocates for the homeless do not support these plans.
